PURPOSE OF THIS POLICY

• To outline the discretionary decision making powers of the Registration Committee

SCOPE

 The Registration Committee may only exercise discretion on those matters as authorized by the HPA or CSHHPBC bylaws.

POLICY

- **I.** The Registration Committee has no discretion to provide an exemption or waiver a mandatory and substantive requirement of the Health Professions Act or College bylaws. Examples of a mandatory and substantive requirement are:
 - Successfully completing the SAC exam according to the College bylaws
 - Completion of application, statutory declaration and other required forms
- II. The Registration Committee may exercise discretion on matters such as:
 - Substantial equivalency of academic and practical training for entry to practice
 - Supervision plans for HIP's in remote locations
 - Provision of extension of time for the successful completion of the SAC exam related to documented extenuating circumstances
 - Publication of HIP exam results
 - Require proof of satisfactory English language skills through submission of results of a language proficiency test
 - Provision of renewal fee payment by installments by advanced arrangement or waive the fee upon receipt of proof of undo financial hardship
 - Failure to satisfy continuing competency requirements
